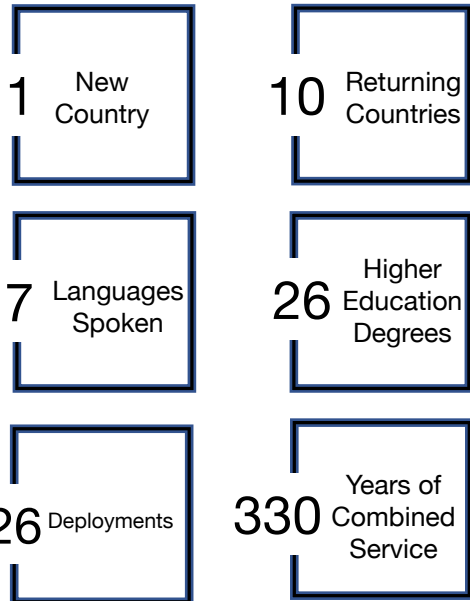

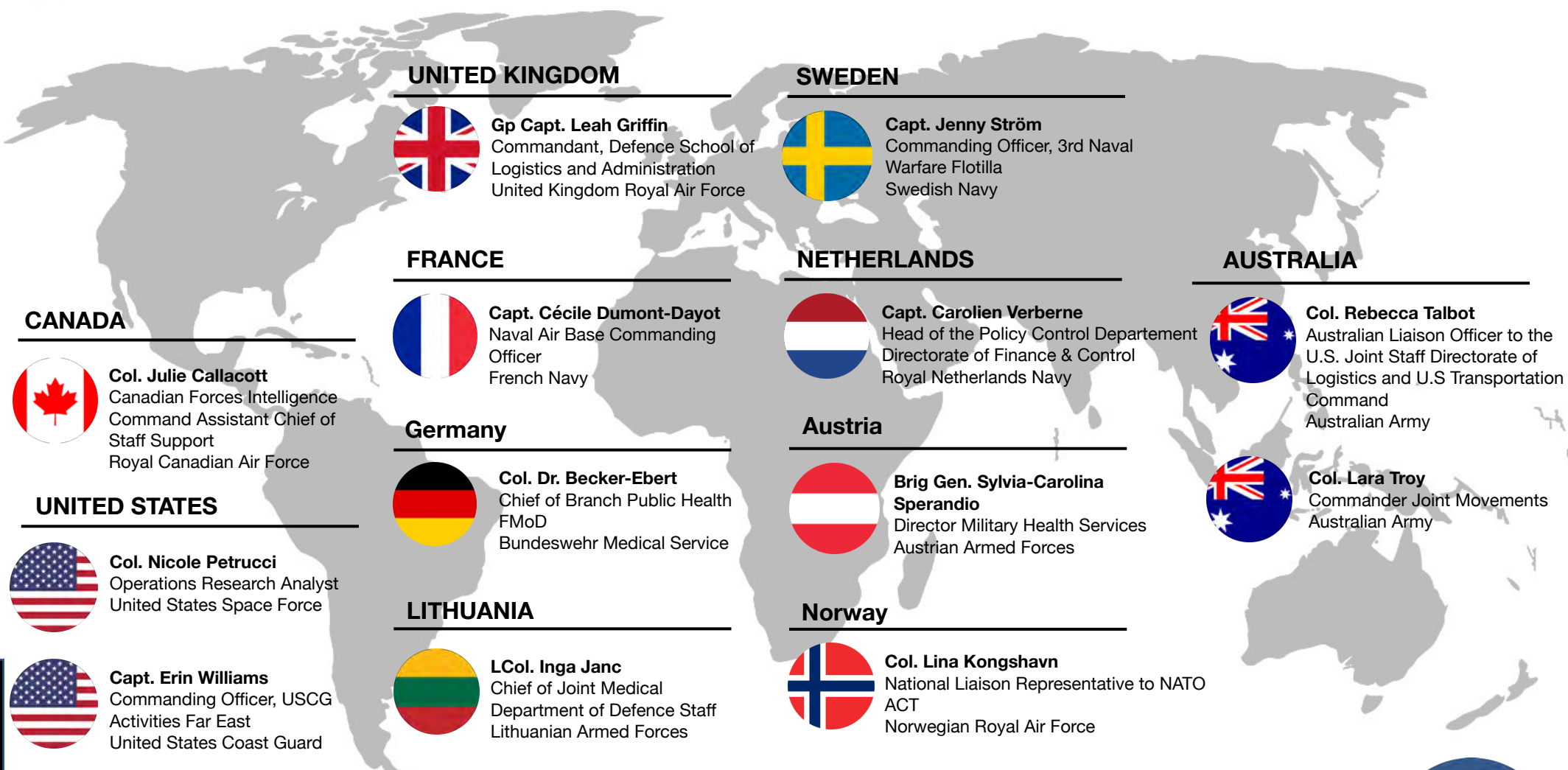

Colonel Dr. Cordula Becker-Ebert
Chief of Branch Public Health, Federal Ministry of Defence (FMoD)
Bundeswehr Medical Service (Germany)

Colonel Cordula Becker-Ebert gained first clinical experience as an intern at a hospital for internal medicine before joining the German Armed Forces in 1994. She started her career as a battalion surgeon and completed her training as a general practitioner in 2001. She worked on medical operational planning, education and training, and military healthcare at division level headquarters. After her time as a desk officer at the Bundeswehr Personnel Office and the FMoD, she took a career break and spent three years in Israel as an accompanying spouse of the German Military Attaché. During this time, she obtained a master's degree in Diplomacy and Conflict Studies.

Afterwards, Col Becker-Ebert held positions related to international cooperation, capability analysis, and procurement planning and as the head of branch in charge of medical planning for missions abroad at Bundeswehr Medical Service Headquarters. In 2015, she was deployed to JMed at the Resolute Support headquarters in Kabul. After her time as chief lecturer of medical service at the Command and Staff College in Hamburg, she became director of education and training at the Bundeswehr Medical Academy. In her current assignment as chief of branch for public health at the FMoD she works on the strategic level in a network with several other federal ministries.

Colonel Callacott joined CAF as an Armored Crewman in 1990 and completed her bachelor's in political science at the University of Windsor. She transferred to the Regular Force as an Intelligence Operator in 1999 and commissioned to Intelligence Officer in the Royal Canadian Air Force (RCAF) in 2002. Following training she was posted to 3 Wing Bagotville, Quebec where she held a variety of positions supporting fighter and expeditionary operations. Col. Callacott conducted three operational deployments in Afghanistan. She completed her master's degree in Strategic Intelligence, is a graduate of the Joint Command and Staff Program at the Canadian Forces College and has completed a master's degree in Defence Studies.

She held a variety of Intelligence positions at the tactical, operational and strategic levels. As Commanding Officer of 2 Air Expeditionary Squadron, she commanded two deployed Airfield Activation Surge Teams (AFAST) to Romania (OP REASSURANCE 2017) and to Mali (OP PRESENCE). She held the position of NORAD Deputy Director Intelligence (2019-2022) and has completed U.S. Air War College (DL).

After joining the three-year course of the French Naval Academy in 1996, Captain Cécile Dumont-Dayot attended different courses in order to become a naval helicopter pilot. As a fully qualified combat pilot, she was deployed on several anti-submarine destroyers. From 2003 to 2008, she took part in EU/UN/NATO joint and combined operations from the east coast of the United States to India passing by Russia and the Equator.

Capt. Dumont-Dayot became an instructor and had under her command 100 cadets for their academic training and their experience among the French Navy. Being the commanding officer of a squadron in 2011, allowed her to command over 120 sailors including the training and assessment of five helicopter flotillas crew members. Capt. Dumont-Dayot joined the Navy Human Resources department in 2014 and successively held the positions of deputy of the Head of PO department and manager of Naval Flight officers' careers.

Joining the Naval Air Base of Lanveoc-Poulmic in the Northwest of France in 2018, allowed her to fulfill the role of the vase air traffic and security OPS Officer and Cybersecurity, Defense, Health and Safety Program officer. She was promoted Commanding Officer of this NAS in June 2021. She is married and a mother of two.

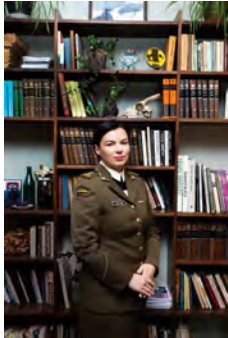


Group Captain Leah Griffin

Group Captain Leah Griffin joined the RAF in 1999 as a People Operations officer following a short period of commissioned service in the Royal Navy (Air Traffic Control). Staff tours have included: Project Officer for the European Air Chiefs' Conference; J4 Infrastructure (Permanent Joint Headquarters); Career Management (Headquarters Air Command); Co-ord to the Chief of Staff at Information Systems and Services (MOD Corsham); and Deputy Head Customer Support Team (Defence Infrastructure Organisation), supporting RAF and U.S. Visiting Forces. Appointed as Officer Commanding Base Support Wing at RAF Brize Norton in 2015, she became the first Commandant of the newly formed Defence School of Logistics and Administration in 2021. Operational tours include Military Assistant to Commander Kandahar Airfield with the International Security Assistance Force, and she deployed under the Train, Advise, Assist, mission to Headquarters Resolute Support as an advisor to the Afghan National Army and Recruiting Command.

A graduate of the Advanced Command and Staff Course, she has a master's degree in Defence Studies from Kings College London. Selected to be a Chief of the Air Staff's academic fellow, she has completed a full-time Master of Philosophy degree, in International Relations and Politics at the University of Cambridge.

LTC Jancevičienė is the chief of the Joint Medical Department of the Defence Staff of the Lithuanian Armed Forces. She and her department are responsible for the medical support system in the Lithuanian armed forces. This includes coordination, improvement and development of the medical support system in order to maintain military operational effectiveness. She works with NATO partners in the development of military medical interoperability and cooperation. She is a member of The Committee of the Chiefs of Military Medical Services in NATO (COMEDS). A very important component of her service is civilian//military cooperation, which includes the establishment of common procedures with the Ministry of Health of Lithuania in order to provide high quality health care for soldiers and civilians during emergency situations. She is medical adviser to the Chief of Defense on medical issues – medical support, military personal health improvement, medical intelligence, preventive medicine and other medical related matters. LTC Jancevičienė specializations include - family doctor (university degree, master) / military medical doctor.

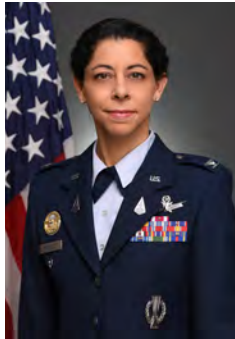


Colonel Lina Kongshavn

Colonel Lina Kongshavn is a Norwegian Defense War College Senior Executive Course graduate. She was commissioned as an Air Defense Officer from the Norwegian Air Force Academy in 1994. In addition, she is a graduate of the U.S. Army Captain Career Course, the Norwegian Defense Command and Staff College, and the Norwegian Defense War College.

Before her arrival as the National Liaison Representative to NATO ACT in Norfolk, VA, she was Chief of the A5-7-9 Division at the Norwegian Air Operations Centre for three years. In addition, Col. Kongshavn has served in several positions at the Norwegian Joint Headquarters and with the Inspectorate of Air Operations in the Norwegian Air Force. Kongshavn has also served with Allied Air Command in NATO for four years, including the position of Executive Officer to DCOM AIRCOM. In addition, she has served as a helicopter liaison at International Security Assistance Force headquarters in Afghanistan. Col. Kongshavn holds a master's degree in Security Studies. Colonel Nicole Petrucci is a Senior Operations Research Analyst in the Space and Intelligence Division of the Office of the Secretary of Defense, Cost Assessment & Program Evaluation. She is responsible for providing timely and unbiased analysis on resource allocation and cost estimation problems to deliver the optimum portfolio of military capabilities through efficient and effective use of taxpayer dollars.

With 20 years of experience in space operations, she has served as a Combat Crew commander, Instructor, and Evaluator on the Minuteman III Intercontinental Ballistic Missile, the PARCS missile warning and space tracking radar, and various classified satellite systems. She was the lead planner for Operation Burnt Frost, the shutdown of USA-193, planned and executed space operations in six Air Operations Centers around the world, and developed and authored numerous space and cyber tactics in use around the world today. COL Petrucci is a master space operator and former squadron commander. She is a graduate of the USAF Weapons School, the School of Advanced Air and Space Studies, and the Eisenhower School of National Security and Resource Strategy.

Brigadier General Sylvia Carolina Sperandio, MD joined the Armed Forces in 1998 as a general practitioner. Beside her specialization in tropical medicine and military aviation medicine she holds a PhD in psychotherapy and an MBA in Health Care Management. As the first female officer of the Austrian Armed Forces, she gained wide experience in commanding different military medical units. As head of the Department of Military Aviation Medicine in the Ministry of Defence, BG Sperandio co-developed and implemented the prototype of the container-based Aero-Medevac-System on the C-130 of the Austrian Air Force.

BG Sperandio participated in international peace keeping missions and was deployed several times as an expert member of the United Nations Assessment and Coordination Team (UNDAC) and as High-Level Coordinator in the framework of the European Union Civil Protection Mechanism (EUCP) to natural disaster humanitarian crisis in Africa, Latin America and Europe. Furthermore, she has served as the Deputy Representative of the Ministry of Defence Equal Rights Working Group since 2003 and a member of the advisory body for the Parliamentary Commission of the Austrian Armed Forces in medical issues.

Captain Jenny Ström joined the Royal Swedish Navy as an enlisted conscript in 1995. Rising through the ranks, she received her latest promotion in September 2021 to the rank of Captain. Capt. Ström has attended various courses at the Swedish Naval Warfare College and Swedish National Defense University (FHS), to include the FHS two-year advanced studies course, earning her Master of Science in Military Science. As a surface officer, specialized in Mine Warfare, she has served onboard in various positions on minehunters and corvettes, including commanding officer of the MCMV HSwMS Kullen and 42.MCM Squadron.

Her tours at sea included training both conscripted and all professional crews as well as being part of live anti-submarine operations in the Swedish littorals and a number of live mine counter operations throughout the Baltic Sea. Capt. Ström has served as staff officer at different command levels and as a teacher at the Naval Warfare Centre. Prior to her current position as commanding officer 3rd naval Warfare Flotilla, Capt. Ström held the position as Head of Recruitment department at the Swedish Armed Forces Headquarters.

Colonel Rebecca Talbot commissioned into the Australian Army in 1998. She has experienced the complexities of enabling Australian Defence Force (ADF) operations and readiness at all levels throughout her career, fulfilling leadership, logistics, training and personnel policy positions. Col. Talbot's career highlights include serving as the Commanding Officer of a deployed logistics unit in the Middle East, for which she was awarded a Commendation for Distinguished Service; leading a joint and fully integrated workforce as Director General of the ADF's only strategic logistics organization; and commanding 10th Force Support Battalion. Her training experience ranges from teaching foundation warfighting tactics through to instructing UK postgraduate courses on an exchange posting. In workforce roles, she's led teams responsible for selecting Army's future leaders and supporting members transitioning from Service.

Captain Erin Williams serves as Commanding Officer of U.S. Coast Guard Activities Far East, leading teams in Japan and Singapore who conduct regulatory oversight of U.S. commercial and national security vessels and assess foreign port security across the Asia and Indo-Pacific regions. She has commanded port and waterway security, marine safety, defense readiness and marine environmental protection maritime missions at three units reaching five continents.

A lecturer at the World Maritime University in Malmö, Sweden, Capt. Williams taught more than 300 graduate students, advancing maritime governance for 55 countries. Leading operations in Alaska, the Great Lakes, and California, she worked closely with industry, government, and tribal leaders to maintain the integrity of the U.S. Maritime Transportation System. Capt. Williams enhanced the organization's marine safety mission effectiveness as a training manager and performance analyst, most recently serving as the Training Director at the Leadership Development Center where she managed three officer accession programs and 19 college accredited, leadership courses reaching 9,000 members of the workforce annually. A respected mentor, Capt. Williams is an ICF-certified coach, former Chair of Coast Guard Women's Leadership Initiative, and a graduate of the U.S. Coast Guard Academy and San Diego State University.
